How can we know anything about Jesus of Nazareth who is claimed to have announced the 'gospel of God' as the 'Son of God' when there seem to be unending sources of Jesus traditions newly discovered and trumpeted by the press? Is the Jesus of the Church's 'Four Gospels' the same Jesus as, e.g., the Jesus of the Nag Hammadi communities? How many gospels are there? Is there a common story behind them all? Why did some early Christian communities decide on just four gospels among 'many' others? We will look at the basic plots of the Four Gospels and compare them to other gospels of the first three centuries. This search for—'what is a Gospel,' and 'how much can we know about the Jesus who was and continues to be worshiped as the Son of God'—generates the pulse of this seminar.
