

CHHI 70023: Evangelicalism in the Global Context  
3 hours

Prerequisites: None

Description of Content: The course explores the history of Evangelical Protestantism (encompassing Fundamentalism and Pentecostalism) in the global context, focusing on the twentieth century. It examines social, cultural, and political factors that fueled and sustained Evangelicalism, as well as beliefs and practices, personalities and institutions, and events and movements that characterized it. While global in overall scope, the course will pay particular attention to Evangelicalism in Korea and the United States.

Class Procedures: Student presentations, discussions, lecture

Requirements (tentative): Class presentations, reflection papers on assigned readings, a short research paper (15-18 pages) and a proposal for it
