The M.Div. degree (81 hours) educates informed leaders who are prepared to engage in effective, critically imaginative ministry in a variety of contemporary contexts. This comprehensive theological and ministerial degree is the primary course of study for those seeking ordination in most traditions.

Denominational Requirements for Ordination (0 to 18 hours)

MASTER OF ARTS IN THEOLOGY AND MINISTRY

The M.A.T.M. degree (48 hours) couples rich theological inquiry with formative practices to prepare leaders for lay ministry, diaconal, and, in specialized ministry, or for service in bi-vocational settings such as teaching, business, social work, NGOs, and non-profit organizations.

CERTIFICATES

Brite Divinity School offers seven distinctive certificates available within the structure of its masters programs.

Biblical Studies

- Interpreting Hebrew Bible in Context or Introduction to the New Testament
- Six hours of advanced coursework in Hebrew Bible, Jewish Studies, and/or New Testament
- Six hours of advanced coursework in Biblical Language: Hebrew I & II, or Greek I & II

Black Church Studies

- Introduction to Black Church Traditions & Cultures
- Four three-hour courses in Black Church Studies chosen with reference to vocational goals and in consultation with the Black Church Studies director

History, Theology, and Ethics

- Six hours of coursework taken to meet Basic Theological Studies requirements History, Theology, and/or Ethics
- Nine hours of advanced coursework in History, Theology, and/or Ethics

Military Chaplaincy

- The Ministry of Pastoral Care
- Three hours of coursework in Military Chaplaincy
- Nine hours of additional coursework in Pastoral Care or courses related to war and peace

Pastoral Care

- The Ministry of Pastoral Care
- Short-Term Pastoral Counseling or Pastoral Conversation & Collaboration
- Two additional Pastoral Theology & Pastoral Care courses to be chosen with reference to vocational goals and in consultation with the student's advisor
- Hospital-based Clinical Pastoral Education

Sexual and Gender Justice

- Fifteen hours of coursework in any discipline with a primary focus on sexual and/or gender justice

Latino/a Church Studies

- Three hours of coursework in U.S. Latina/o Christianities
- Twelve additional hours of coursework in any discipline with a primary focus on Latina/o religious traditions and communities

COLLABORATIVE DEGREES

Brite Divinity School and Texas Christian University offer students the opportunity to earn masters degrees from each institution. These unique programs allow students to integrate advanced learning across professional fields and to prepare to serve in a wide variety of ministerial settings and non-profit organizations. Candidates for collaborative degrees must be admitted to Brite Divinity School and the respective college at Texas Christian University.

Brite Divinity School in collaboration with the Neeley School of Business:

- M.Div./M.B.A. (69 Brite / 33 Neeley)
- M.A.T.M./M.B.A. (39 Brite / 33 Neeley)
- M.T.S./M.B.A. (40 Brite / 33 Neeley)

Students in Neeley's M.B.A. program will transfer 15-21 hours from coursework completed at Brite toward their electives.

Brite Divinity School in collaboration with the Harris College of Nursing and Health Sciences, Department of Social Work:

- M.Div./M.S.W. (66 Brite / 45 Harris)
- M.A.T.M./M.S.W. (33 Brite / 45 Harris)
- M.T.S./M.S.W. (34 Brite / 49 Harris)

Students will transfer 9-15 credit hours between the two institutions to satisfy elective requirements.
